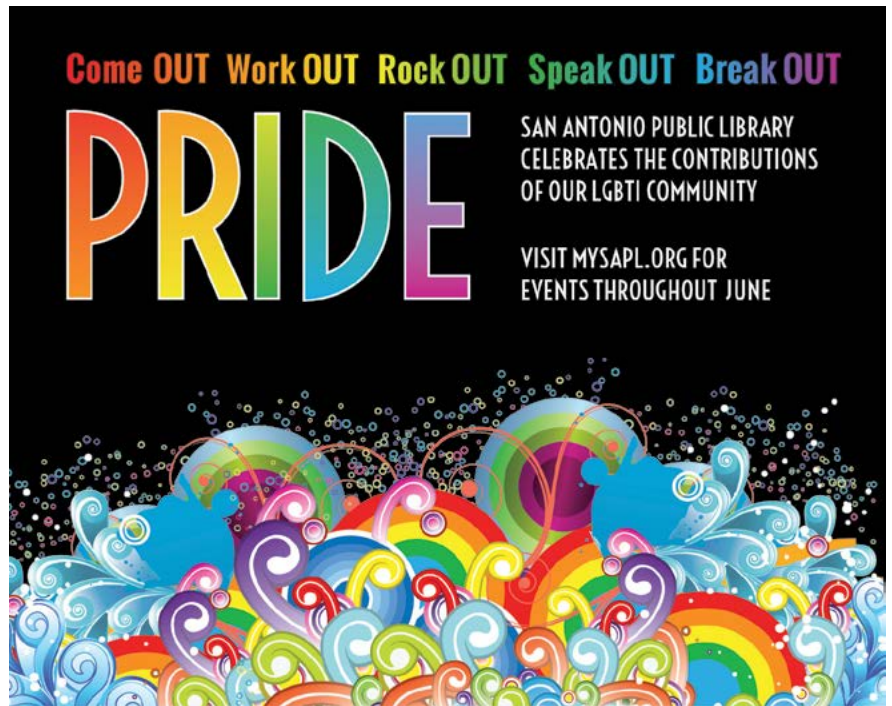


WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SAPL
