**Speaker:** Jesse Villarreal

Topic: Events Surrounding the Writing of the book "Tejano Patriots of The American Revolution"

Summary: Jesse Orlando Villarreal, Sr. was born in Westside San Antonio on Feb 4, 1945. He attended Our Lady of Guadalupe Elementary School and then Sidney Lanier High School where he graduated in 1964. He served in the U.S. Army from Sept 1965 to Sept 1967 and was stationed in Germany. After an honorable discharge, Mr. Villarreal worked with the U.S. Department of Defense at Kelly AFB in San Antonio. He married Connie Perez of San Benito, Texas in 1972. Mr Villarreal graduated from Our Lady of the Lake University in 1975 with a B.A. degree in Social Work. In 1978, the family moved to Dallas, Texas, where he worked with the U.S. Department of Labor in the Bureau of Labor Statistics. In 1980, he transferred to Austin, Texas where he continued working in the Federal Government with the U.S. Department of Labor OSHA as a Safety and Health Compliance Officer until his retirement in 2002 with 35 years of service to our nation.

#### My Heritage.com to offer 1940 census for free.

"The images of the 1940 U.S. Census will be released by the National Archives and Records Administration on April 2, 2012... MyHeritage will then make all images immediately available to the public and begin the gradual process of transcribing them and making the index searchable, pledging a 98% or higher degree of accuracy." In other words, the indexes will not be available until some time after April 2 even though the images will appear on that date."

#### **London's Westminster Parish Records Online**

Leading UK family history website <u>findmypast.co.uk</u> has published online for the very first time parish records held by the City of Westminster Archives Centre. The Westminster Collection at findmypast.co.uk comprises fully searchable transcripts and scanned images of the parish registers, some of which are over 400 years old.
